Episode Three is on Wednesday 10th June at 2:30pm UK time. It happens at withforabout.com





What to expect in this week's episode:



An introduction from Heart of Glass and With For About 2020 curators **Cecilia Wee** and **James Leadbitter**.



Dr Emma Young is a Consultant in Emergency Medicine working in Newham Hospital A&E department. Emma will be talking to us about her experience of working in A&E during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Artist and researcher **Youngsook Choi** will be presenting a special virtual version of her collective performance Unapologetic Coughing. The piece is a performative response to the hysteria around Coronavirus.



Choreographer **Zwoisy Mears-Clarke** shares his reflections on barriers to accessing art and culture, talking us through the pick-up service he developed for performances at Sophiensaele theatre in Berlin.



Live artist **Fox Irving** will be talking with **Lois Keidan** about the Working Class Artists Working Group that Fox developed.





We'll watch *Amazing Art*, a film about the Disabled Avant-Garde's (**Katherine Araniello** and **Aaron Williamson**) Charity Art Therapy Classes.



We'll hear from theatre director, author and performer **Neil Bartlett** who will share with us his own experiences of having lived through an epidemic as a young man and of being part of the revolutionary queer journey in the UK.
